*Reliable internet connectivity is a game-changer for African libraries, enabling access to vast digital libraries and collaborative platforms, transcending geographic barriers.*

- *Enables access to academic journals and online courses.*
- *Crucial for libraries serving rural or underserved communities.*
- *Investment in affordable broadband and Wi-Fi hotspots is essential for equitable access.*



# Libraries as Digital Hubs in Underserved Communities

*By evolving into digital hubs, libraries bridge the digital divide and foster inclusive learning environments, especially where access to quality education and technology is limited.*

Bauchi, Nigeria (2023)

*Partnership with a local ISP offered free Wi-Fi. Daily visits increased by **42%**, and OER downloads **tripled** in six months.*

Kibera, Kenya (2022)

*Introduced a blended learning lab combining digital literacy training with open science resources. **67%** of participants improved digital skills.*

*These hubs also offer digital literacy programs, equipping users with critical online navigation skills.*

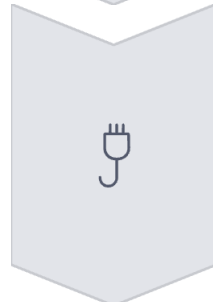
# Collaborating with Research and Education Networks (RENs)

*RENs provide specialized, high-speed connectivity tailored for academic purposes. Librarians are crucial in fostering these partnerships to expand capacity and co-develop services.*



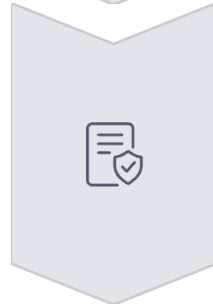
### Advocacy

*Actively involve local communities to tailor digital services and ensure sustainability.*

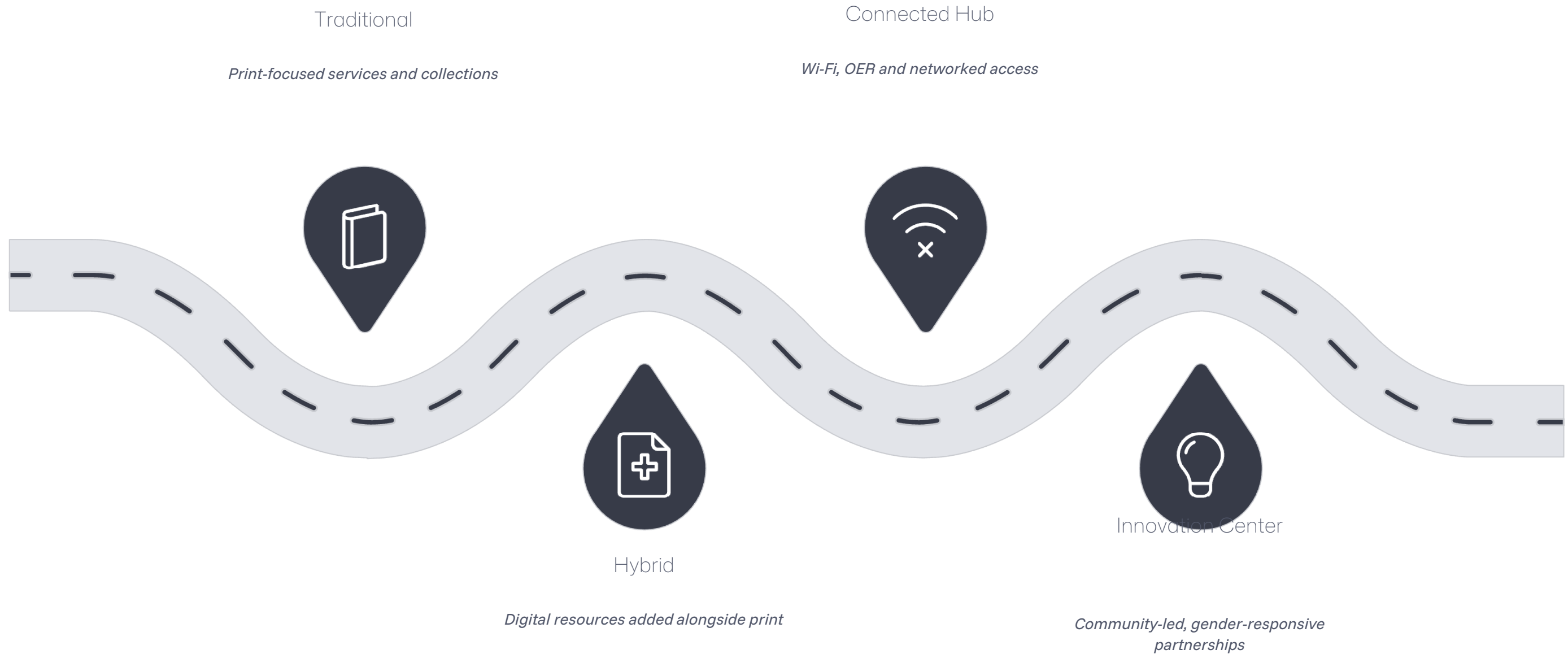


## Policy Advocacy
